Members have ten days to register any objections to these applications. All have Board approval.

Because of numerous appeals because of vacations and what not The Board has decided to extend the Summer White Sale to the 15th of September. Applications received or postmarked as of that date with the full \$875 paid will have this year's dues excused. Here is your opportunity to treat your friends to a real bargain. We only have seventeen applications to go to make the twenty five we sort of budgeted for, from the Summer White Sale.

After the 15th of September we will move into our Fall program. For those applications after September 15, dues for the 67-68 season will be figured on the basis of days of use of the facilities charged at the rate of \$ 4.50 per person per day.

Thus if a family of four for one reason or another was able to ski only six times during the season, we would figure as follows: \$ 4.50 a day X 4 people X 6 days = \$ 102.00 dues. This would be the equivalent of \$ 156.00 of skiing at a commercial area.

But if this family of four skied fifteen days we would figure it: \$ 4.50 a day X 4 people X 15 days = \$ 270.00, but the dues would be only \$ 150.00. \$ 270.00 of skiing at Holimont would cost \$ 390.00 at a commercial area, which they will get for our \$ 150.00.

This family of four would only have to ski six days at a commercial area to equal \$ 150, or three weekends and we had 15 weekends last year.

OPEN HOUSE AND OKTOBERFEST

October 7 and 8 will be the annual Open House Weekend at Holi Mont. Our friends at Holiday Valley have scheduled theirs for this weekend also. The chair lift will be running for free rides up the hill. We will have display material in the Chalet to show your prospective members. Officers and Directors will be on hand to answer questions of your guests.

The Hayride for the children which was so popular last year will be operating both days (the Belgian Mare says her little daughter is now big enough to leave).

Arrangements for the Open House are being handled by our enthusiastic Canadian Member Norm Byrnes. We would like some of the girls from the various areas to be in attendance as hostesses.

We will have our new speakers donated by the Rochester group operating with some beautiful Alpine music tapes just received from Austria, thanks to Egon Millich, of Hamilton.

With the extra luxuriant foliage this year beginning to turn, it should be in its prime for this weekend, as it was last year. If your skiing friends have not seen Ellicottville at this time of year, it is worth the trip for that alone, and the view from the top of our slopes is magnificent.
