And application blank is enclosed for your use --- because-- on November 1, 1969, the initiation fee for HoliMont will be \$1,000 cash payment, or on the deferred plan, three payments of \$ 300 each and a fourth payment of \$250, for a total of \$1.150 on the deferred plan.

The Board also approved the acceptance of no more than twenty one year guest memberships this year.
