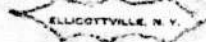

BOARD BUSINESS

The Board meeting of January 7, was a serious affair in which The Directors reviewed a complete Treasurer's Report and Budget which showed that even though this year's skiing did not start as auspiciously as last year's, that with good snow and Members' cooperation in bringing guests on weekends, and during the week, we may still come close to meeting our budget, and end up the year without a large assessment. This is extremely important and every member should do his part.

Scotty gave a complete rundown on work in progress and completed and in his usual optimistic manner reported that his snow order has not been cancelled, but like many items, has just been back-ordered by our supplier. Delivery is expected momentarily, and HoliMont is ready. Think Snow!

Membership Chairman Bob Harter reported three new applications received, and three new names added to our waiting list. Any Member who has a friend interested in joining the Club, should read the section of the By-laws covering application for Membership, discuss the person with Bob Harter, and get the name on the list. As openings in the Club occur, the waiting list will be processed in chronological order. There is a limit to the number of members, there is no limit to the number on the waiting list. The only sure way of being considered for membership is to be on the waiting list. The only sure way to insure a healthy Club isto have a healthy waiting list.

One Thursday afternoon in the Summertime a few years ago, Dr. Bob Vaughan drove down from his Chalet because a man was poking around the slopes and run-outs. He was surprised to find Otto Schniebs giving Holimont the once-over. Otto was smiling and seemed very pleased. He just happened to be in Western New York and he had dropped by to take a look at "His Darling". Yes, of all the ski areas Otto Schniebs had laid out, he said, Holimont was his darling.

Otto Schniebs, skiing pioneer, dies at 79

Otto Schniebs, America's venerable skimeister, died in October at the age of 79.

A German immigrant whose love for the mountains and the ski sport was never diminished, Schniebs immortalized the words, "Skiing is not just a sport, it is a way of life."

He was a member of the Ski Hall of Fame, appeared in *Who's Who in America*, held the New England Council's coveted Silver Bowl and was memorialized by a monument at Schniebs Pass at Aspen.

Schniebs's contributions to skiing are legendary: He brought the Arlberg technique to this country in 1927; he founded the American Ski School; he was the author of numerous books on skiing technique; he was the first to tout the skiing potential of the Colorado Rockies; he coached the Dartmouth ski team in 1930-36 to an unprecedented six intercollegiate championships.

In 1956, Schniebs settled near Whiteface Mountain, N.Y., where he began the area's now-famous ski shop. He is survived by his wife, two daughters and five grandchildren.

Otto Schniebs was a contemporary and good friend of our own Honorary Life Member Karl Fabbner. A night spent in their company, if you were lucky enough to do so, was a night to remember; they made plausible (and audible) the phrase 'Skiing is a way of Life'. A letter from Otto to Holimont on the occasion of our Party honoring Karl Fahrner, spoke of their warm and long lasting friendship.

Perhaps, all Members do not know that Holimont didn't just happen, but was designed and laid out by this most outstanding Professional in the business. The emphasis here was on transitional design, making it possible for a beginning skier to progress from novice to expert on a well designed complex of slopes. Holimont lent itself ideally to this concept, and Otto Schniebs wanted to make the most of it.

We here, express our sorrow for the passing of our great and good friend, Otto Schniebs, and affirm our determination to keep Holimont forever, "His Darling"

In the early days of HoliMont, Beth printed up thousands of song sheets, in French, German, Italian, Yiddish and even in English. We put some English words to some German Songs in an attempt to evolove a HoliMont Song, an Alma Mater so to speak. The fact that we do not have a generally accepted song, means we have to keep trying. With so many more members to work on the project, we would like to start some sort of contest to come up with such a song.

We would like to plant a seed, with one we learned up in the Laurentians. Some gifted HoliMonter may be able to put some good singable English words to it. We learned it under the title "SUR LES COTES DE ST. SAUVEUR"; we have been singing it Sur les cotes de HoliMont. Here's the rousing chorus:

Ah, Que la Vie est belle, belle, belle
Ah, Que la Vie est belle, belle, belle
Sur nos Ski.....WHOOO!

And the Verse:

Sur les cotes de HoliMont...HoliMont (Repeat the line)
On recontre des tas de skieur...de skieur (Again, repeat)
Et qui glissant (Repeat) sont Amateur (Repeat)

And the Second Verse:

Faut a prendre a faire du ski, faire du ski. Chorus

There are a couple more verses, but maybe the above will give you enough to work on....if you need any help with the translation, just get in a corner with our FBF gal (That's Full-Blooded French), Cecile Raes and she'll give you a French lesson, and, you won't forget the song, (better take a number). I can teach you the tune, but not in the same corner.

Now, if you have a better song, don't be bashful, please submit it. Just let's get something going, so we can make with the music. With Al Mack becoming a member, we've a good foundation for a chorus, and with George Allen as Kappelmeister, we might be able to take the show on the road.

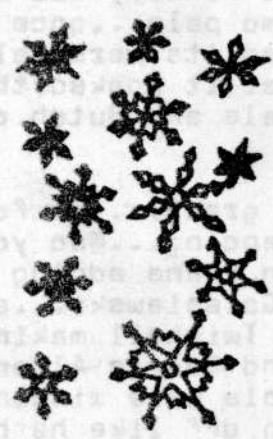
HOLILEAVINGS

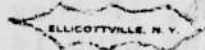

HOLIMONT BUSINESS

The Guest Policy which worked so well last year, has been the subject of much discussion the past few weeks.. The Club so sorely needs guest income to balance the operating budget. Members accustomed to uncrowded conditions, complain bitterly, if there is much of a lift line. Practice has shown that the Club can easily accommodate 200 guests. The Guests are supposed to have had reservations made in advance. Because of the uncertainty of conditions, members have been reluctant to reserve in advance, and have been telling their friends to come down at the last minute when conditions become known. Thus it was that over 200 guests appeared the last weekend of January, many of them saying they were friends of so and so. This makes it tough on Amie and slows operations at the ticket wicket. Due to complaints, we adhered to the 200 limitation on the 6th of Feb., and many guests who appeared were turned away or had to wait until noon, much to the disgust of the members who had invited them. With Skiing at a premium this year, the Board reaffirms the Club policy of no more than 200 guests on any operating day, and strongly appeals to the membership to comply with the guest reservation program announced in the November 'Leaf. In it Members were asked to Call Barb Lavtar between the hours of 2 - 4, at 716-699-4431, and reserve well in advance, and to cancel as soon as possible when it is known that your guests cannot come. If you encounter a friend for whom you have not made a reservation, check and see if we can accommodate him (we need the money); we will not admit people on the basis of being a friend of so and so.

Capt. Charles Boycott was sent over many years ago to deal with the Irish on their lands. The Irish wouldn't deal. They just stayed away, and said: "If you send over anybody else we'll give him the Boycott treatment". And thus the word 'boycott' became a part of the language.

HoliMont's reputation as a wonderful fun club, with a tremendous esprit de corps, came from the fact that a majority of the members knew a majority of the members on a friendly basis. They got to know each other at the parties, which was the reason for the parties. If people do not attend the parties, if they boycott them, the whole idea breaks down and the Club is less and less friendly.

Some people do not realize that the parties help to underwrite much of the social program, like the hot wine parties, hot chocolate parties, movies, decorations, awards and such. If a few attend the parties and thus support the social program, which everyone enjoys, the few are paying for the many. If the HoliHutters stay in their HoliHuts, if the HoliVillans stay in HoliVille and the Townees stay in town, the opportunity to meld this Club goes by the board. Meanwhile the few turn out some marvelous hors d'oeuvres and our Wine Steward donates almost fifty gallons of wonderful wine in a season, while segments of the membership never come near a party. If you are a member, you not only are welcome, there is a slight moral obligation to put in an appearance once in a while. Let's not let a wonderful tradition die out for lack of a little attendance. Why not check the Calendar and here and now resolve to attend one or more of the parties left this season, and get better acquainted with HoliMont.

P.S. HoliKids are not welcome at the Cocktail parties. Recently four young wolves were on their way to eating one end of the snack table before we hit the panic button. Meanwhile we have had some very fine parties. The Gowanda Group did themselves proud, the Buffalo/Golebiewski Monte Carlo with a considerable assist from the Bobbsie Twins Cooper/Fraser doubling as auctioneers, turned a nice profit for the Club. The Valentine Family Party, with the slides, movies and Ski Patrol Safety talk was a high point. Coming up, the Ski Patrol February Frolic, Pennsylvania Choo Choo, and the Winter Carnival, should figure in your plans. On March 11, the Teenager Dance, while an Adult Bus trip to an eating spot is away, should both be fun. Better check with Barry McKague for a spot on the bus, only 30 seats, I thank. And coming up Ryan's Riot, the St. Pats Party hosted by the Mighty Ryan Clan. Let's make them bigger and better and better.

With Scotty's back-ordered snow arriving by the bushel (sometimes in one flake, like last Sunday) and with the Guest limit being crowded, this puts more skiers on the slopes and the matter of Ski Etiquette Rules laid down by the Board last year and published in the center section of the Sept. 'Leaf, which most of you did not see, are here repeated, with a warning that beginning this weekend, anyone guilty of infractions or violations of the rules will have their skiing privileges cancelled for the day. Any Member who sees a HoliKid crashing the line, or quietly sneaking ahead, should take the youngster to a Director, or Scotty, or to the Hill Police if they are operating, and report.. him. His lift pass will be taken away and will be returned at the end of the day.

Following are the rules:

1. No crashing the lift line, go to the end of the line and keep your place.
2. Do not get off the chair lift at mid-station
3. Stay in the Tee-Bar Track. Do Not swing out of the track, or let your tees swing when you unload, and only unload at the mid-station or at the top.
4. Wear no scarves or loose clothing that might catch in the lifts. There have been accidents from this cause.
5. Ski in control at all times; shooting the hill is dangerous, only allowed when no one is in the area.
6. The trees on the run-outs were planted for a purpose, do not ski between them; we want them to live.
7. Look up the hill before entering a new trail; the downhill skier has the right of way.
8. Mogul-hopping is o.k., but jumping is allowed only on the official Club jump, or on jumps constructed and o.k'd by Scotty.
9. Use common sense...respect the rights of other skiers.
10. It's the responsibility of every member to obey and to enforce these rules, or report violations.

Parking's is always a nuisance, but members and guests who park in unloading areas and no parking spots make it worse. Please instruct your guests to heed the signs, and set an example too. In the last 'Leaf issue we mentioned 'grated rears' from sitting on benches on which hot dog cookers had been placed, this week we mention the 'Lange Look', which happens when people sit on benches, on which someone has just placed his muddy boot to buckle it. People also stand on the benches with the same effect. We would not know this except we have been noticing rear ends lately, and some of them are a pity, not due to their carelessness, really, but due to the carelessness of people who do not respect rears.

While you have been traipsing (up and down H'Mont) our H'kids have been racing, all up and down Western N. Y. In 7 races, 4 slaloms and 3 Giant Slaloms, app. 90 boys and girls from 8 areas raced. We had 12 boys and 3 girls in it. The final accumulated F.I.S. points (federation internationale de ski, dum,dum), resulted in the selection of the NFSC Team (that's Niagara Frontier Ski Assoc.) of 15 boys. Sorry, but the gals didn't qualify, but of the 15 H'Mont had five places: Mike Fuller, Cam Watson, Tom Hoge, Sage Cutler and Paul Philp. This certainly says something for Bill Watson's Racing Program.

At Wing, in the Western N.Y. Division Finals, with the top 17 boys picked to compete at Lake Placid in the Eastern Championships, Mike Fuller was 4th, Cam Watson 13th and Tom, Sage and Paul didn't quite make the 17 cut-off. Great going fellows and good luck at Placid.

And in the annual Hamilton/Chedoke-HolliMont Classic last week, H'Mont piled up 163 points to 136 for their opponents, and our five top boys were away. It seems that we have racers in depth under Bill's program. Congratulations! Watch for the announced dates for the Club's Fahrner Cup races, which are open to all HoliKids. The winners will have their names inscribed on the beautiful Fahrner Trophy that hangs over the Fireplace. All boys/girls eligible.

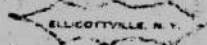

TREASURER'S REPORT

The 1971-1982 Season started off slowly, but we were blessed with enough snow in February and March so that our year, while not a huge success, has not been a disaster. We are fortunate in being able to limit our expenses on such things as number of employees and maintenance work on the area if we do not have plentiful snow from mid-November thru April. As you all very well know, such was the case this year, and we attempted to keep a tight rein on our expenses as a result.

Our Income and Expense for this year and last year through March 30th, are as follows:

The dues are lower this Season because last year we were collecting from some members who were in arrears, and you can see the guest fees were off \$14,000 this year due to poor conditions during Christmas Season. It would appear that we were operating at full capacity four or five days during the Season, but then this is a relative term because at no time did our lift lines exceed eight minutes, except when we had a lift breakdown. We will not have any more income, but our expenses will continue to June 30th. It is hoped that the year will balance out without going in the red, too much.

Your capital assessment last year was applied to such capital projects as the Garage, the new Sno-Cat that was purchased at the end of last year, and the new Powder-Maker.

Your Directors are currently considering a capital program for this Summer, and the size of the assessment to be considered will be effected by the program approved by them. In all, it was a successful Season and your Club is in prime financial shape.

It will be a fine addition to the H'Mont picture for this Fall.

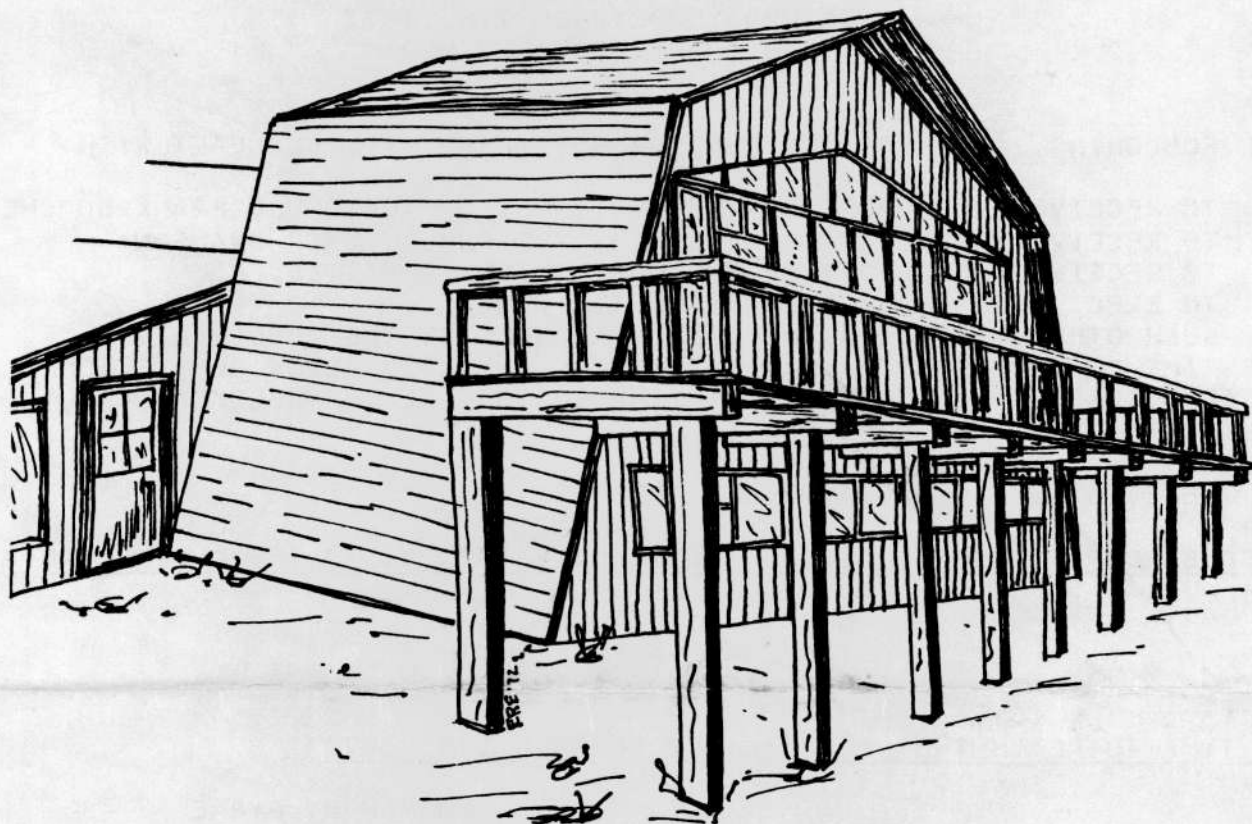

AT ELECTIONS OF DIRECTORS THE BALLOT SHALL INDICATE THE MINIMUM NUMBER, IF ANY, OF DIRECTORS THAT MUST BE ELECTED, AS WELL AS THE MAXIMUM NUMBER, IF ANY THAT MAY BE ELECTED FROM EACH ZONE TO CONFORM WITH THE FOREGOING LIMITATIONS, AND EACH NOMINEE SHALL BE IDENTIFIED ACCORDING TO THE ZONE IN WHICH HE RESIDES. IN DETERMINING WHICH NOMINEES HAVE BEEN ELECTED, SO LONG AS ANY ZONE SHALL HAVE LESS THAN TWO DIRECTORS RESIDENT THEREIN, NOMINEES RESIDENT THEREIN SHALL BE DEEMED ELECTED IN DESCENDING ORDER OF THE NUMBER OF VOTES RECEIVED BY THEM, AND THEREAFTER UNTIL EACH ZONE SHALL HAVE FOUR DIRECTORS RESIDENT THEREIN THE REMAINING NOMINEES SHALL BE DEEMED ELECTED IN DESCENDING ORDER OF THE NUMBER OF VOTES RECEIVED BY THEM, AND UPON BEING ELECTED OR IN OFFICE FOUR DIRECTORS RESIDENT IN A ZONE, NO FURTHER NOMINEE RESIDENT IN SUCH ZONE SHALL BE ELECTED AND ANY REMAINING NOMINEE RESIDENT IN SUCH ZONE SHALL BE DEEMED DEFEATED. IF AT ANY ELECTION THERE SHALL BE NO NOMINEE OR INSUFFICIENT NOMINEES RESIDENT IN A ZONE TO ENSURE THAT THERE SHALL BE AT LEAST TWO DIRECTORS RESIDENT THEREIN, ANY SUCH NOMINEE SHALL BE ACCLAINED IN OFFICE, AND THEREAFTER SUCH ZONE SHALL BE EXCLUDED IN DETERMINING THE SEQUENCE OF ELECTION OF NOMINEES AS HEREINBEFORE PROVIDED, AND WHEN EACH ZONE FOR WHICH THERE SHALL BE NOMINEES AVAILABLE HAS FOUR DIRECTORS RESIDENT THEREIN, THEN THEREAFTER THERE SHALL BE NO LIMITATION ON THE NUMBER OF DIRECTORS RESIDENT IN A ZONE UNTIL THERE SHALL BE NOMINEES AVAILABLE HAS FOUR DIRECTORS RESIDENT THEREIN,

AMENDMENTS TO THE CLUB BY-LAWS - CONTINUED

THEN THEREAFTER THERE SHALL BE NO LIMITATION ON THE NUMBER OF DIRECTORS RESIDENT IN A ZONE UNTIL THERE SHALL BE FIFTEEN DIRECTORS IN OFFICE. IF DURING HIS TERM OF OFFICE ANY DIRECTOR SHALL CHANGE HIS RESIDENCE FROM ONE ZONE TO ANOTHER HE SHALL NOT BE DEEMED DISQUALIFIED THEREBY TO CONTINUE IN OFFICE, BUT AT ANY SUCCEEDING ELECTION OF DIRECTORS HE SHALL BE DEEMED REPRESENTATIVE OF THE ZONE IN WHICH HE THEN RESIDES. IN FILLING ANY VACANCY IN THE BOARD UNDER PARAGRAPH 7.2 HEREOF THE REMAING DIRECTORS SHALL BE BOUND TO APPOINT AS DIRECTOR A MEMBER RESIDENT IN THE ZONE IN WHICH HIS PREDECESSOR RESIDED."

ARTICLE V - INITIATION FEES

"THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL FIX FROM TIME TO TIME SUCH INITIATION FEES AS IT MAY CONSIDER NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE TO BE PAID BY THE APPLICANTS FOR EACH CLASS OF MEMBERSHIP. 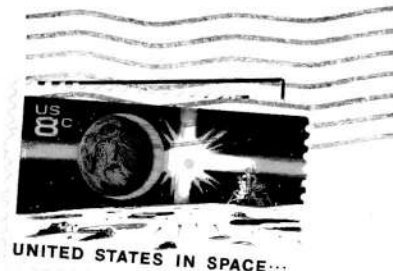

1. NO CRASHING LIFT LINES.
2. DO NOT GET OFF THE CHAIR AT MID-STATION.
3. STAY IN TEE-BAR TRACK...UNLOAD ONLY AT MID-STATION OR AT THE TOP.
4. DO NOT LET TEE-BAR SWING.
5. NO SCARVES OR LOOSE CLOTHING TO BE WORN THAT MIGHT CATCH ON LIFTS.
6. SKI IN CONTROL AT ALL TIMES.
7. DO NOT SKI BETWEEN THE TREES ON THE "RUNOUTS". (WE WANT THEM TO LIVE.)
8. LOOK UP THE HILL BEFORE ENTERING THE NEW TRAIL.
9. THE DOWNHILL SKIER HAS THE RIGHT-OF-WAY.
10. MOGUL HOPPING IS OKAY ... JUMPING ONLY ON OFFICIAL JUMP.
11. SHOOTING THE HILL IS DANGEROUS ... ALLOWED ONLY WHEN OTHERS ARE NOT IN THE AREA.
12. USE COMMON SENSE ... RESPECT THE OTHER SKIER.
