
WINTER CARNIVAL

HOLIMONT RACING CAMP - One of our most successful Holimont programs is the Christmas Racing Camp. The high calibre of skiing on our slopes is in no small measure due to the instruction given to our young skiers. For each of four days of this holiday season, 130 young skiers received four hours of instruction from an enthusiastic and capable group of instructors. Not all continue on in competitive racing, but each of them will improve his skiing and make Holimont the pleasant place to ski that it is now.

Not only do they become expert skiers, but they learn to care for their equipment. All of this is availabe at a fraction of the cost charged in other areas. Part of the cost of this program is born by proceeds from Jet Set Night.

The Racing program, of such benefit to the Club, is carried on using only two of the down hill slopes for part of each day. This year our program is under our new Director of Racing, GREG WEBER. He brings and enthusiasm and dedication to this program in keeping with our past high standards.

A NEW DIMENSION FOR LIFE AT HOLIMONT - HOLIMONT WILDLIFE PRESERVE Some months ago a group of Holimonters got together and said wouldn't it be exciting to take Holimont's 400 acres, and in a way that didnot conflict with downhill skiing, expand our use of the area by creating a wildlife preserve for hiking and crosscountry skiing. After much thought, study and conversation with many members, the group agreed upon the following objectives and goals:

OBJECTIVE: To create a Holimont Wildlife Preserve that does not conflict with skiing.

- GOALS: 1) To encourage an awareness and appreciation of Holimont's natural resources.
 - 2) To encourage the attraction of wildlife to the area by effective plantings, pond development, birdhouses and feeding stations, animal shelters, etc.
 - To develop nature trails for year round hiking and cross country skiing. Prohibit hunting on Holimont property.
 - 4) To discourage unnecessary destruction of animal and plant life by prohibiting the use of motorized vehicles on all Holimont off-the-road land.

The Board of Directors has given approval to these goals and has created a Holimont Wildlife Preserve Committee to proceed with the study and development. The development would be a Holimont project for club members and in no way would jeopardize Holimont's control of the land. The committee as currently constituted is as follows:

LETTER TO THE EDITORS

"The Board of Directors of Holimont have allocated funds for the promotion and possible instigation of some type of wildlife or bird sanctuary on Holimont property located south of the skiing area at the top of the mountain.

We, the undersigned members, do hereby protest this, and future such action because of one, some or all of the

following reasons:

1) The expenditure of HoliMont funds not related to the activity of skiing and without direction of the membership.

2) This will impose one more restrictive covenent on the

use of HoliMont property.

3) This area is used by many of the members andtheir guests for partridge, turkey and deer hunting. It would be unfair to deny them this use for such a short part of the year as well as being possibly detrimental to the area by upsetting a preexisting balance of nature.

4) If use of this non-skiing area were to be denied to the local populace who have been using it for many years, there may be retaliation in the form of vandalism to HoliMont property and/or private properties associated with HoliMont.

5) The cost of enforcement of any restrictive use of this remote area would be prohibitive, and without enforcement, only HoliMont members would honor such restriction."

One of Holimont's members, Don Green of Burlington, has become an international yachting celebrity as a result of the outstanding performance of his yacht, Evergreen, in returning the Canada's Cup to Canada.

The cup whose history begins before the turn of the century represents supremacy between the US and Canada on the Great Lakes. It has been challenged 14 times, with yacht clubs from the U.S. victorious 9 times, and Canada 5 times.

The series consisted of a number of races. Despite a series of mis-fortunes - a broken centerboard; the mast going overboard after a fitting gave way - Evergreen, clearly faster than the U.S. defender Agape, outpointed her rival and won the trophy convincingly.

We look forward to Don's presentation of the full story of the winning of the Canada's Cup at "Evergreen Night." And we wish to extend our sincere congratulations to Don Green and Allan Megarry on their remarkable achievement.
