Try to work Together and not overstep our authority as has happened before.


Our first





- DO NOT JUMP AT INTERSECTIONS OR IN ANY AREAS IN WHICH A (2) COLLISION WITH ANOTHER SKIER COULD TAKE PLACE.
- (3)SKIER PROCEEDING DOWNHILL HAS THE RIGHT OF WAY OVER SKIER ENTERING FROM SIDE TRAIL. Note: When entering an intersection, skier should slow down and look up.
- DO NOT SKI SO FAST THAT YOU ARE UNABLE TO STOP QUICKLY ENOUGH TO AVOID COLLISIONS.
- (5) A SKIER WHO HAS STOPPED ON THE HILL, BEFORE PROCEEDING, MUST GIVE RIGHT OF WAY TO ANYONE ALREADY SKIING ON THE HILL.
- SKIERS MUST STAY IN TRACKS WHEN USING T-BAR.

A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Holimonter:

Re: New Chairlift Facility

Have you heard? We're going to have a new chairlift at Holimont. Between the October annual meeting and Christmas an opportunity developed for your Board to acquire a chairlift and to realize an idea that has been in the minds of many skiers for many years. Your Board, after considerable discussion, thought and committee reports decided at its meeting on December 7th that the purchase of a new Borvig double chairlift at the low price of \$210,000.00 was too good to pass up. Enquiries disclosed that a comparable chairlift from another manufacturer (Hall) would cost about a third higher.

The need for this additional uphill lift became apparent to your Board when all the facts and figures were presented by the various Committees. The utilitarian requirement today to open up the large relatively unskiied area between the T-bar and Plumb Creek (25 - 30 acres) and the probable future increase in membership caused by the right of our children to join our Club at their option at anytime after school age, made it clear to your Board that now was the time to act.

The method of financing had to be determined and a possible Bank loan considered and arranged. In this regard the Board agreed to the admission into our Club next summer of 20 new members. Over the next four years, by natural attrition, we will be back to our present limits of 380 active members.

It was noted that this chairlift and other necessary improvements anticipated at this time (additional snowmaking and snowcats, etc.) should not cost more than \$100.00 capital assessment per year per member. We then entered the Christmas - New Years holiday season. The lack of snow resulted in a small number of skiing members at Holimont and the problem of communicating our exciting plans to the membership became complicated. It was decided that the only way to explain our plan at this stage was to call a membership meeting. Unfortunately the inability to communicate quickly to the total membership resulted in only a small percentage of members attending this informational meeting. Hence this letter to the full membership to present our total plan.

Enclosed with the letter you will find a summary of some of the reports given by Committee Members on various aspects of the project. If you have any comments on this new project, we would appreciate receiving them in writing.

Having started on this long-range plan for a chairlift to complete our uphill facilities your Board is continuing in its efforts to open new ski areas around our present facilities. With this in mind a Long Range Planning Committee will continue to study these future facility developments and report to the membership from time to time.

Please be assured that the main objective of your Board remains to provide our members with the best possible ski facilities at the least possible cost. Your Board is convinced that these expanded facilities are a positive step towards this end.

Summary of Jack Swanson's Report

- 1. Our club is a non-profit association subject to New York State taxes. We survive on 2 kinds of funds:
 - a. Operating funds dues, lift income, depreciation
 - b. Capital funds initiation fee, capital assessment, land sales

Capital funds should not be used for short-fall in profit and loss statement. They should be used to improve the area's facilities to increase our skiing enjoyment.

- 2. Every year we spend \$50,000-70,000 in capital improvements i.e. chalet, snow-making, snow cats (now 5) and lifts.
- 3. Now 1979-80, looking into the future the Board decided a new chair lift was indicated -- prices going up each year, our skiing membership increasing, and the market looking right.
- 4. Holimont is solvent and can afford a major improvement for our skiing pleasure (present accumulated capital reserve \$100,000)
- 6. If we repay loan at \$60,000 per year, will be paid off in 4 years.

- 7. Other capital expenditures will be limited to \$25,000 per year (except for possible land acquisition special status).

Junior Member is equal to Active member's initiation fee at the time of joining less \$500.
Example: if \$2,000 initiation fee in force when Junior Member joined, Junior initiation fee = \$1500 payable over the years between joining and age 33 when Junior must become an Active member.

Note: Present Active member initiation fee is \$2500, and therefore, Junior Member initiation would be \$2000 to age 33.

- 4. Junior members do not pay any additional assessments for operating or capital funds.
- 5. Any child of an Active member is entitled to become an Active member at any age by paying full fees, ahead of any waiting list.

Considerable discussion followed on whether this age should be limited.

- 6. Junior members have no vote now. Lengthy discussion developed on whether Junior members should pay capital assessments each year the same as an Active member and/or be allowed to vote.
- 7. A committee to consider above alternatives was struck, consisting of 6 Active members and 6 Junior members, to be co-chaired by Walt Brownell and Dave Robb Jr.
