We invite you to offer guests an opportunity to ski at Holimont. Family, friends, potential members and others are welcome. Remember half of our revenues are derived from guest fees.

Every effort is being made to spread out people on our slopes and we do not anticipate overcrowding with our five lifts in operation. Remember if the Exhibition lift appears crowded early in the morning or after lunch simply ski to the T-Bar or Meadow chair.

As to reservations, we ask that you phone in advance so that your guests are not embarassed when they arrive. We try to accommodate guests without reservations when they tell us a member was to have called ahead for them. Remember we are a Club and we wish to continue our Member/Guest process. There is a limit of five guests but we try to be flexible if you occasionally phone with reservations for more then five. We are less restrictive during the week but ask that you make reservations for week-day guests as well.

Please cancel your reservations if your guests will not be coming or ask them to do so. We will monitor the no-show situation and will advise the member if there are repeated instances of no-shows.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Many thanks to the Hill Committee for the great snowmaking and grooming!

Sunset West has been very successful so far. Ski away into the sunset with us and enjoy a tremendous adventure on our new slope. How do you get there? Meet at the top of the Exhibition Lift between 1 and 3 p.m. on Saturday and Sundays. Take Scotty's snowcat lift to the top of the slope. Ski to the bottom, and enjoy a stagecoach ride, provided by Northrup Construction Co., back to the Main Chalet.

I would like to share some concerns with you. We feel that this Club should maintain the quality of our member/guest relationship which has been a part of HoliMont for so long.

We as members have a responsibility to monitor the system. For instance our parties are open to the members and their guests only. Please accompany your guests. They are welcome, but they must be with you — the member. Each person must be 21 years of age to partake of any alcoholic beverages. This rule will definitely be enforced.

OUT OF BOUNDS is where you are if you are skiing on private property which surrounds residences alongside HoliMont slopes. Please inform your children and your guests that such areas are full of hazards: standpipes, shrubs, rock gardens, stairways and piles of firewood — all hidden under the snow. Driveways and roads are frequented by vehicles whose drivers do not expect to see skiers. Such areas are not patrolled. Skiers have caused damage to gardens, shrubbery, driveways and railings. Anyone skiing in such areas is subject to discipline.

We all agree that it's a privilege to be a HoliMont member. With privilege comes responsibility. Let's all work together to keep HoliMont the best Club ever!

WRITE TO YOUR LEGISLATORS HELP TO LOWER INSURANCE COSTS

INSURANCE COSTS - HELP! HELP!

As we all know, insurance is the fastest growing cost element in HoliMont's operation. Three years ago it was about 4% of our total operating cost while this year it is 13%. Our insurance costs have increased 120% during the three-year period and we are better off than most ski areas.

New York State Assemblyman Matt Murphy will introduce a bill in Albany in the next two weeks defining the personal responsibilities of a skier. We need to have this bill passed if we are to get our insurance costs under control. Over 20 states already have such legislation. This includes the New England states and Michigan. Canada also has similar legislation.

The wording of the final bill is not yet available, but the goal of the bill is to place responsibility where it belongs. For example, if two skiers collide in the middle of a hill and an injury results, HoliMont should not be held liable. If a skier goes off a trail into the woods and hits a tree, the skier should be responsible. This does not remove all liability from HoliMont for if we were to have a defective chair or an out-of-control groomer on the hill, etc., we would be liable.

We need the help of our New York State members. Please write to your state assemblyman and senator and ask for their support of this bill. We hope they will be willing to be a sponsor of the bill. The Cattaraugus County legislators (Sen. Jess Present, Republican, and Assemblyman Dan Walsh, Democrat Majority Leader) have pledged to be sponsors.

Write to your legislators now. Please send a copy of your correspondence to me so that we can show that our members are behind this bill. We need every upstate vote <u>for</u> this legislation as it is expected that the powerful lawyers lobby in the New York City area will be formidable opponents to its passage.







The roads are 50% complete now; by early spring both the bridge and the road will be complete enough for people to start building.

We're almost sorry to see the bright sun melting the snow. As our season melts away don't let that enthusiasm fade: look forward to next season when we'll

see you at the bell!

GUESTS!!!

A number of complaints have been received by the Board of Directors concerning "excessive" numbers of guests on weekends during February. Some have felt the lift lines were too long. Others have been appalled at the overcrowding of the rest rooms and Main Chalet generally. The lift lines were somewhat longer than normal but seldom exceeded 10 minutes and more often were 3-5 minutes even when they appeared to be very long. The Main Chalet situation has been intolerable.

The Operations Committee agrees that there were too many guests particularly on Winter Carnival weekend. That situation was complicated by the fact that we had the best weather ever for a Carnival. Accordingly a very high percentage of members skied and nearly all guests utilized their reservations. It may interest you to know that on most weekends from 20% to 50% of reservations have not been used. We also allowed a group to ski here that weekend which in retrospect was a mistake.

For the remainder of this season we do intend to limit the guests to a smaller number than was the case during February. As you may have noticed we are trying to better understand and control the guest situation at our <u>private club</u>. Reservations must now be made by guest name. We hope this will help us to better monitor the "reservations/no show" and "show/no reservations" situation. We also should avoid having a guest group utilize unfairly a reservation legitimately made for someone else. If we find repeated instances of unused reservations or guests utilizing a member's name when no reservation was made we will contact the member.

Controlling the total number of skiers on the hill will never be an exact science because we never know how many reservations will be used, how many members will ski or what the weather and snow conditions will be. We are, however, determined to "manage the process" within an overall guideline that the sense of the membership is to have fewer total guests than has been the case on recent weekends.

We have already begun to enforce the longstanding rule which forbids making reservations on Saturday or Sunday morning for skiing that same day. Limiting the guests to a smaller number also probably will require us to cut off reservations prior to Saturday for some weekends.

I hope that these comments are responsive to your concerns.

FROM THE HILL

- Mike Duffy, Hill Committee

Before the completion of the 86/87 Ski Season, your hill committee was actively meeting on a regular weekly basis to discuss near term improvements and capital projects.

The Sunset Development Committee requested that we research a chair lift for the new area and make a presentation and recommendation to the Board for consideration and approval. We were surprised to learn from the early quotes that the cost of a triple chair lift was <u>less</u> than a double. Because the vast majority of ski lifts are purchased by public areas, their demands and needs for triples and quads has made the double a non-standard production item. The next logical consideration was to move the Exhibition Lift to the Sunset area and purchase the new chair lift (triple) for Exhibition area. That idea was shattered with firm quotes to move Exhibition Lift that nearly approximated the cost and erection of a new lift.

The selection process then became a study of quality, price, reputation, engineering and safety standards, and strength of company. For those and additional considerations, we selected CTEC, a triple chair with a capacity of 1200 skiers per hour. By simply adding more chairs we can increase it to 1800 skiers per hour (a possible future consideration). We think you'll like the quiet and smooth ride of this high-tech, state-of-the-art lift.

We have had some questions as to the reliability and safety of our oldest lift — Exhibition. As was reported at the Annual Meeting, and is repeated here to refresh those memories, an independent engineering firm specializing in this field was hired to make recommendations. Following their advice, we replaced the cable, inspected all grips, reset two towers and made structural changes to insure its safety. Exhibition Lift has served us well for over 22 years and with proper care and maintenance should serve us many, many more.



FORESTRY CONSERVATION AT HOLIMONT PAST AND PRESENT

- Chuck Twichell

From the beginning the forested areas at HoliMont have been affected drastically by our presence. Land that once was used for grazing and timber development is now used for skiing; therefore the variety and shape of trees in the landscape has changed and will continue to change.

Thanks to Scotty Lavtar and Bill Merk, we no longer have the windswept plain in the lower Exhibition area that was present in the early years; it necessitated late winter loading at what was called the mid-station. They

planted windbreaks of evergreens and since then snow is held on the runouts for the entire ski season. That was the beginning.

We once had an outbreak of Inch Worms that ate a large portion of the foliage in Western New York's woods. It was predicted that if it continued we would lose our hardwood windbreaks. A helicopter spray operator with the improbable name of Crash Heatherly was contacted and budget money was made available to spray HoliMont the following year should the Inch Worms return. Fortunately they went the way of the dinosaur so spraying was unnecessary. That non-event started people thinking of the value we place on our wooded areas and consideration was given to a long-term program of forest management with the special needs of our ski area in mind.

We were fortunate to have a well-known and respected professional forester available in the person of Bruce Robinson. Tucked in the budget annually is about \$2000. that has been used for the past three years to plant seedling trees such as hemlock and white spruce that will enhance the beauty and effectiveness of our windbreaks.

Bruce is addressing other concerns: How do we reduce the impact of snowmaking on the trees we have? What will replace the beech trees that are dying in the upper areas of Sunrise? How do we best maintain the evergreen windbreaks that are in place now? Where do we need more plantings to help make our skiing last longer each year? How do we develop the kind of forest that makes for better windbreaks while at the same time use the tall timber type hardwood trees to their best advantage?

On September 16th several of us walked with Bruce over the total area. We concluded that past plantings are doing well. The work that Pete Widger has done in removing competing trees and dead trees is a big boost. We talked about having more evergreen trees visible in the landscape to enhance the beauty of the area. This will be done.

From time to time members have commented that perhaps we should expand the program to include the needs of wild life. We agree and Bruce feels it fits. We hope to hear from interested people further about this. Let's hear it for the bluebirds!

On a hillside overlooking Ellicottville is a home of Bavarian architecture nestled into pines and trees all planted there many years ago by Slavko Lavtar and his wife Barbara.

They designed and built their own home the year they were married and have been adding to their homestead ever since that initial investment over twenty-five years ago.

Their family now includes twin daughters, Heather and Heidi, now almost eighteen years of age, and son Carl, almost fifteen.'

Slavko Lavtar, known to all of the people here in the community and at HoliMont as "Scotty," was born in Yugoslavia and commenced skiing when he was very young, as is apparent to those who have viewed his very smooth and graceful style on the slopes. Skiing has been both a recreation and a livelihood for him.

During his forty some years of skiing Scotty has done it all. He skied competitively, became a certified ski instructor, qualified for teaching downhill, cross country and jumping and also qualified for the Ski Patrol. It's easy to see that Scotty has a long and broad background in the field of skiing.

Interestingly one of Scotty's favorite students was a girl named "Barb" whom he taught to ski at Glenwood ski area several years ago. They were married and she is of course the Barb whom we all know and who has been managing HoliMont's office for many years.

Scotty has been at HoliMont since 1964-65 and is familiar with every square inch of the place. He has seen it grow from one lift, a few slopes and a small clubhouse to what it is today. He has been a part of its growth through the years and possesses a unique ability to be able to stand at the top of a wooded area and visualize where the lift, slopes and trails should be positioned. This ability is truly an art which Scotty has displayed throughout his tenure at HoliMont.

Scotty presently is responsible for the operation, maintenance and repair of the eight lifts. He and his staff oil, grease, scrape, paint and mechanically tune up all lifts every year. They also are responsible for the maintenance, repair and rebuilding of all the structures relative to the lifts.

He and his crew maintain the areas around each lift by mowing, cutting brush, removing trees, cutting firewood and implementing our forestry management program. This program requires planting trees as well as cutting the bad ones to insure a good healthy forest now and in the future.

This year he has also supervised the construction of the new triple chair lift on the Sunset slope. There also was a new trail to be cut, 'dozed and seeded, along with some grading to accommodate the loading and unloading areas.

It doesn't take long for anyone to recognize that lifts at HoliMont always look like new. They display the pride of Scotty and his crew who put many hours of tender loving care and hard work into manicuring the lifts.

Barbara Lavtar has been extremely active in the progressive growth of HoliMont as well. Barb has seen HoliMont grow from a few families to the present size of almost 900 families. She is also gifted in many ways; one of these being her amazing ability to recognize and call by name over 90% of the people who belong to HoliMont. This in itself is a great accomplishment. Barb is an absolute encyclopedia of knowledge about HoliMont history.

Barb presently manages the office and her duties are many and diverse. She is the one responsible for taking, organizing and being sure that reservations for guest skiers are properly handled. She also handles the guest ticket sales and sees that this too is properly administered. Heather and Heidi assist their mother during the very intense times of the year when picture taking for passes, ticket selling and reservations are just plain overwhelming.

During the off-season Barb works side by side with the Membership Chairman and takes care of all the correspondence pertaining to membership, invoicing of the members, filing and all the complicated tasks inherent with this large a membership.

She also works part time during the off season with the Business Manager, President and Treasurer. She is responsible for the various tasks relative to all their work.

Since the computer was acquired, Barb has taken on additional tasks, working diligently, aided by a consultant, to feed more and more information into it on a regular basis.

She also is now a part of the HoliLeaf staff and performs much of the manual work

which goes into this publication.

It is without a doubt a very difficult job to write an article short enough to fit and still comprehensive enough to include all that Scotty and Barb do at HoliMont. We are quite sure that we have only touched on everything that they have done for HoliMont both past and present.

Our intention is to introduce them to the new members and remind the old members of all they have contributed to the beautiful HoliMont area. Part of the beauty of

HoliMont has to be directly related to the Lavtar family.




Special Note


SOMETHING NEW

Our racing program provides coaching, racing instruction, and detection and correction of faults in basic ski technique. Racers must learn to turn efficiently in order to race successfully. We deal with about 180 racers of all ages who fall into six major groups: 13 years and under, travelling and non-travelling; 14 and older, travelling and non; adults, hot shots and otherwise.

Competition builds character and self-respect and teaches responsibility and cooperation. The kids learn about winning and also about losing which is just as important. They are out on the hill training or racing each day. Usually they get together on Saturday nights to prepare their skis for a Sunday race, which often involves a 7:00 a.m. departure. It is a happy, healthy, busy life for them.

Our coaches are all former racers and attained high levels within the racing structure in either New York or Ontario. They have all attended clinics in the past and will continue to do so to keep up with current technique and methods. They are all devoted to their kids (of whatever age).

For our top racers the program begins in December with some early races which can be important for their seeding during the coming season. For the others, the season starts with Christmas Camp which runs 4 days between Christmas and New Year's culminating in a full-fledged race and banquet with trophies and awards.

During the season, 25 to 30 of the 13 and under kids travel to races in the Niagara Frontier Ski Council on the first six Sundays. A Council team is selected to go to a divisional championship where a further selection is made to go to the State Championships, which were held at Whiteface this year.

Another 30 kids from the younger age group train and race at HoliMont each weekend in preparation for the Taylor Series in the spring which is aimed at racers not making the divisional team.

The adult group consists of former racers and experts interested in trying racing. They find gate training a new and interesting challenge and enjoy as well our different approach to technique.

Since we attend a lot of races, we have a responsibility to run some. Each year we run an NFSC race, an Empire race, a Taylor race, the Niagara Cup, the Christmas Camp race and the Club Championship. In addition we are putting on the Empire finals and the State Championships for Junior II's.

Please renew your memberships in NYSSA and the USSA. You must belong to USSA with a competitor's license to: be on the national points list: race in classes I & II; race in the III & IV Divisionals and State Championships. You must belong to NYSSRA for all of the above and to race in more than one Niagara Frontier Ski Council race. Note that for the III & IV Divisionals and States, the membership deadline in USSA is February 1, 1988.

Before Christmas Camp there are a few races the I & II's should try to prepare for. There is a downhill camp at Whiteface from December 11 to 18, a GS on December 19, and an invitational downhill on December 22. On December 23 & 24 there are two open races at Bristol and Brantling. These usually end up being tremendous opportunities to lower points.

A WORD ABOUT EQUIPMENT. If you are planning to buy new equipment for your kids (or anyone else): skis should be 3 or 4 inches taller than the child (a bit more for adults) and be flexible; poles should have handles with straps that wrap around the wrist, not grips that encase the hand: boots should naturally cant the leg forward and have some forward flexibility; bindings should match the skier's weight, be compatible with the boots, and have shock-absorbing capability.

Christmas Training Camp will run from December 27 to 30, followed by a race on the afternoon of the 30th. The Seasonal Program will run for 10 consecutive weekends starting on Saturday, January 2, and ending on Sunday, March 6. The Christmas Camp banquet will be held on December 30.

Listed below are various programs and prices. These are open to all members and guests. In addition, the racing center is available to all, including non-participants, if you need a place to work on your skis.

An application form is included with this mailing, and we again plead for prompt response. Better and earlier information means a better program.

JUNIOR CHRISTMAS CAMP - Cost: \$65.00 Sunday to Wednesday, December 27 - 30, 4 hours each day starting at 9:30 am. This camp will concentrate on establishing sound skiing fundamentals, as well as training in gates. Open to all junior racers.

ADULT CHRISTMAS CAMP - Cost: \$45.00 Same dates as above, 2 hours each day, starting at 10:00 am. Training in gates or correcting technique, as required. Open to all adults.

SEASONAL PROGRAM - TRAVELING - Cost: \$110.00 Coaching at all races, and 4 hours daily training at Holimont on non-race days. Program starts on Saturday, January 2 and runs for 10 weekends. It will be extended to cover late season races as necessary. This option is for junior racers planning to participate in NFSC and USSA races.

SEASONAL PROGRAM - NON-TRAVELING - Cost: \$85.00

Same dates as above. 2 hours coaching per day on Saturdays and Sundays starting at 9:30 am. This program is available to racers as young as 6 (and younger if they are competent skiers) and is designed for junior racers not wishing to travel to "away" races, or those only wishing to participate in the Taylor Series.

SEASONAL PROGRAM - ADULTS/(TEENS) - Cost &75.00 (2 days) \$45.00 (1 day) Same dates as above. 2 hours a day starting at 10:00 am. Training in gates, dual slaloms, etc.
